## eWHORM's first Progress Meeting

In early June 2024, the eWHORM consortium gathered in Vienna to discuss the progress in combating NTDs and helminthiases. The meeting highlighted significant achievements, including the completion of the Master Protocol for clinical trials and the development of a virtual training tool for parasite detection. The consortium emphasized the importance of capacity building, global collaboration, and mentorship in advancing their mission.

## Capacity Building: Tutorials, Workshops and Networking



**Capacity Building** is one of the key aspects of eWHORM. Though the main work related to it is conducted under the lead of BNITM within WP5, capacity-building activities are visible in all parts of the project. **Tutorials** were established to support the implementation of the LAMP assays in all the clinical trials, the **virtual assessment tool** for the examination of parasites, or the **workshops** organized in Gabon aimed at enhancing the clinical trial and management capacities of the technicians on site.
